First Aid Kits and Defibrillators

We have first aid kits in all the church school classrooms and both kitchens. We also have AED's (Automated External Defibrillator) on every floor: these are marked with big signs on the wall near the cabinet containing the AED. In that cabinet there is also Narcan and other emergency first aid items.

We also have a large first aid kit in the acolytes changing room. *If you are in need of emergency medicine, you should of course call 911*, but feel free to use the first aid kits for minor cuts and scrapes as needed.

The Wellesley Freedom Team

The Wellesley police department has set up a task force to address incidents that may arise in our town involving racism or other discriminatory conduct. That group, called *The Wellesley Freedom Team*, is seeking to raise public awareness of its existence as a resource. The Wellesley Freedom Team would like you to know that we are available to victims of racism or bias, or to those who witness such disturbing behavior. Our volunteers provide a safe, confidential space for people to air concerns, be heard, and be connected to available resources that can address victim/witness concerns. The Wellesley Freedom Team, established in March 2021, is part of a network of seven teams in the Greater Boston area.
