Icon of the Week

Folk Nativity

Maria (Mary) is sitting or kneeling to the right of the child. Seen by the spectator, she is on the left. Behind or next to her is the ox, which does not actually appear in Luke's Gospel but is considered a kosher animal and symbolizes the people of Israel and Christianity. From the left, i.e. from Mary's side, the shepherds approach with their sheep. They represent the believers who bring sacrificial animals, food and clothing.

Giuseppe (Joseph) is on the left side of the baby Jesus, that is, on the right if seen by the viewer. Next to Joseph is the donkey, also not mentioned in Luke's Gospel. The donkey is interpreted as an impure animal and symbolizes non-religious or even pagan people. The three wise men also symbolize the pagan world. Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthazar are the "wise men of the East" who donate gold, incense, and myrrh. With youth, middle age, and old age, they are on the one hand a symbol for the different stages of people's lives. On the other hand, their origins from Africa, Asia, and Europe are associated with the three continents known at the time. Since Melchior represents the European continent and therefore the West, the designation "Three ... from the East" is not entirely correct.

It is also important that the stable with the crib is always open and freely visible to the viewer. This is a symbol that everyone, regardless of nationality and faith, is welcome and welcomed by Jesus. If there are several angels around the Christmas crib, they form the heavenly choir. Unlike the announcing angels, they are located on the right, left or both sides, next to the stable. The star symbolizes the complete process of Jesus' birth and only appears from this moment on in the dark sky of the Holy Night. The three saddle animals (not in this icon) belonged to the three wise men represented the continents known at the time: the elephant, is usually placed next to King Gaspar, representing the African continent; King Balthazar rides on a camel as a representative of Asia, and Melchior rides a horse as a representative of Europe.



Christmas & Epiphany Services

Christmas Eve Services Sunday, December 24 (3pm & 5pm will be broadcast)

Children's Service at 3pm

This half-hour service is aimed at young children. We sing carols, hear the Christmas story, and have a children's homily (no Holy Communion). The service is followed by cake and refreshments.

Family Eucharist at 5pm

This hour-long Holy Communion service is the most well attended Christmas Eve service at St. Andrew's. The service ends with the church darkened and everyone holding a candle as we sing "Silent Night."

Choral Service &

Holy Eucharist at 10pm

This is a traditional service with communion, carols, choral anthems, and a sermon. A 20-minute musical prelude precedes the hour-long service with the full choir and a string quartet.

Christmas Day Service Monday, December 25 at 10am

This is a relaxed one-hour service with communion, Christmas carols, and a short homily. This service will not be broadcast.

Epiphany Fireside Service & Dinner Sunday, January 7 at 5pm

This Holy Communion service—in the parish hall with a roaring fire—is attended by an intergenerational congregation. We hear a short Epiphany homily and sing Epiphany hymns followed by dinner. This service will not be broadcast.
