When the people saw that Moses delayed to come down from the mountain, the people gathered around Aaron, and said to him, "Come, make gods for us, who shall go before us; as for this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him." Aaron said to them, "Take

off the gold rings that are on the ears of your wives, your sons, and your daughters, and bring them to me." So all the people took off the gold rings from their ears, and brought them to Aaron. #### Museum Trip: Protest in Print

On **Sunday, October 29**, 20 of us will go to the Davis Museum at Wellesley College to tour *Protest in Print*, an exhibit centering on Martin Luther and the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. Luther tacked 95 theses onto a church door in Germany on October 31, 1517, and the world has never been the same.

Protest in Print is a dazzling collection of 16th century prints and books which explore the history and popular thought that supported Luther's grievances, and the impact of print medium on the circulation of his ideas. Several Albrecht Dürer prints are part of this memorable exhibit.

From 11:45am to 12:30pm, we will host a German-inspired lunch with sausage, sauer-kraut, and beer, as well as quiche, in the Harvey Room at St. Andrew's. We will depart for the museum at 12:30pm.
