



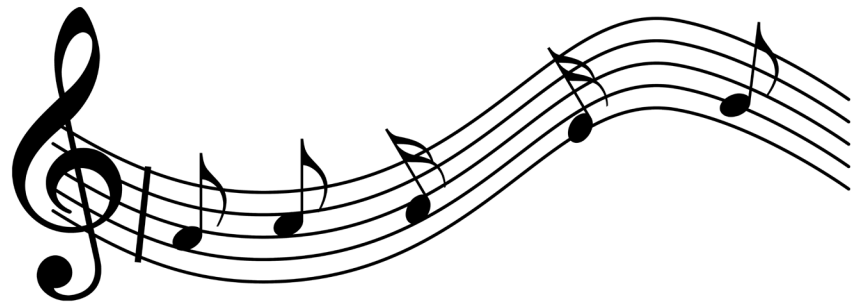

Rector's Letter

How Are They To Hear?

The Reverend Addison Hall

The scripture says, "Everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved." But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? And how are they to proclaim him unless they are sent?

— St. Paul's letter to the Romans 10:13ff.

Every year on the Sunday before Thanksgiving we celebrate the feast of our patron, St. Andrew, the brother of St. Peter and one of the first disciples called by Jesus to assist him. We read the passage above every year during this celebration, because it speaks to Andrew's role as a messenger of the gospel, one who proclaims the saving power of God.

Andrew's recorded individual deeds as a messenger are few. More to our point as a parish community is Andrew's place in the team. Most of our work as messengers of the gospel is teamwork. We come together to remember the message, and we work together to proclaim it. We proclaim it in our worship and in our learning groups, in our outreach missions and in our stewardship of our headquarters, in our welcoming of new members and visitors, in our fellowship gatherings, and in the care we provide to each other in ordinary times and especially in times of crisis.

We give thanks for that teamwork on St. Andrew's Day, and also on the first Sunday of November, when we celebrate the feast of All Saints. On that day we give thanks for our parish community, both the living and the dead, and also for the whole extended

family of Jesus' followers throughout space and time, the holy church of God.

In our local community and in the worldwide church certain individuals stand out by virtue of their special gifts from God. We celebrate those gifts, but more especially we celebrate the combined gifts of the whole family, the Holy Spirit's work of melding individual gifts into a greater whole. All of us are encouraged and strengthened for the work of proclaiming God's saving presence by our membership in this holy family of God. With that family as a context and an inspiration, each of us is able to give more than any of us can give as an individual.

As we gather on All Saints' Sunday, on the Motown Madness fellowship evening, and on St. Andrew's Day, we give thanks for our being called into this holy family of Jesus' followers, and for the energy that comes to us from our work as a team, both locally and well beyond our local setting. —Addison Hall

You're a vital part of our church family – we're glad you're here!

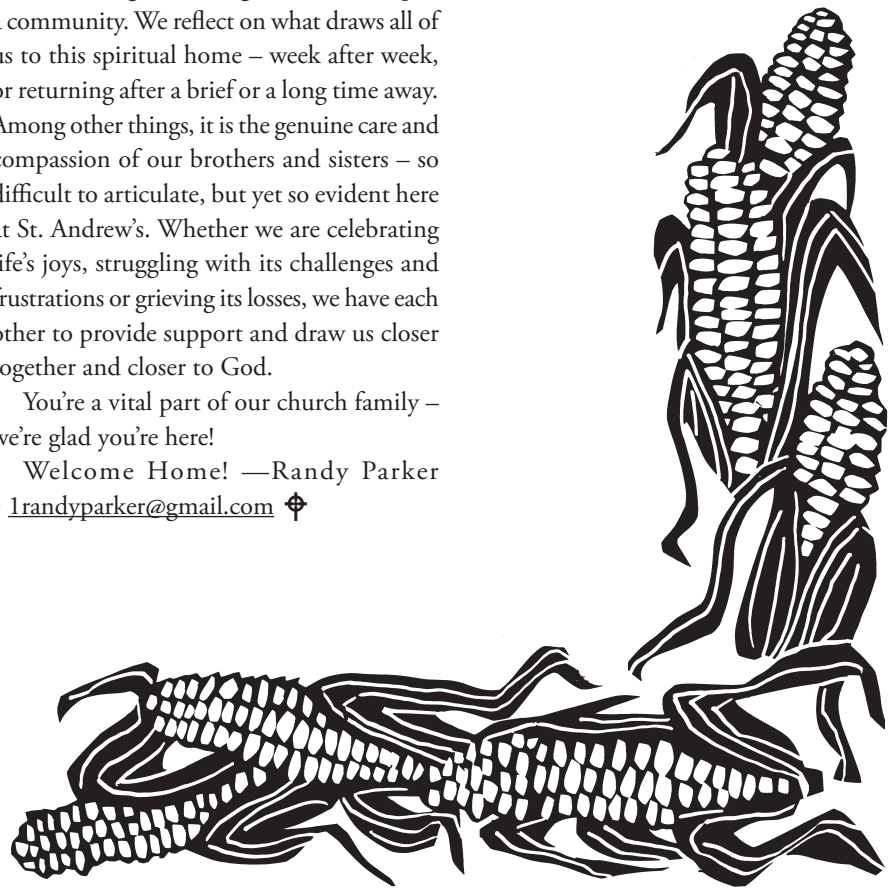

- The Wellesley Food Pantry needs our support throughout the year. Special drives include the spring SouperBowl and Lenten collections and this month's

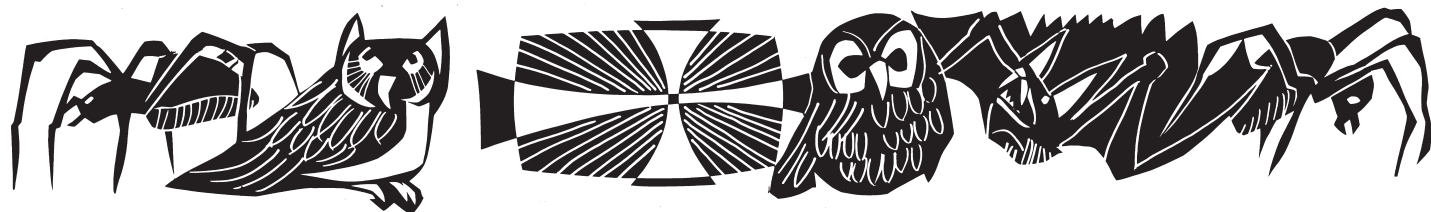

As early as the 16th century, these wreaths were given a theological meaning by Christians and used to mark the liturgical season of Advent – a period in which the Church engages in self-examination, meditation and a sense of joyful anticipation as we celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation and proclaim Christ's promise to come again.

Four Hundredth Anniversary

The Authorized (King James) Version of the Bible was a translation four years in preparation, initiated by King James I, and finally made available for use in 1611. Though never officially authorized for use, it quickly gained popularity both for public reading in worship and also for personal use by the faithful. Its majestic phrases still ring in our ears, and its influence upon great writers and politicians (Abraham Lincoln, Winston Churchill) was profound. To celebrate this anniversary, St. Andrew's has produced a recording of selections from the King James Bible, made by Richard Bradley in the 1980s for use by students at the Rivers School. Included are the stories of creation, of David and Goliath, passages from the Psalms, the prophets, the Gospels (Jesus' birth), and a gorgeous concluding passage from the Revelation to John. A bonus feature is an introductory set of guidelines for public reading. The cost of production has been underwritten by a generous parishioner, and all proceeds from the sale of the CD will benefit St. Andrew's. Suggested donation: \$20. 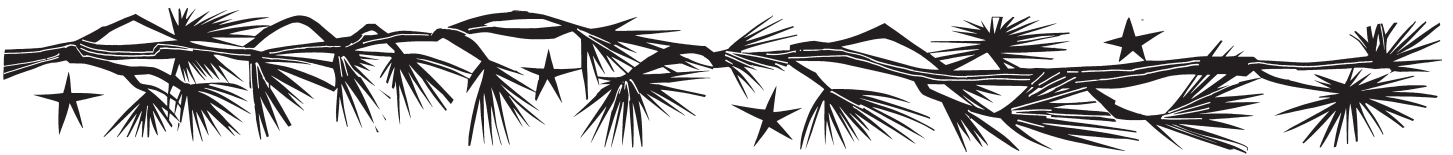
