## Rector's Letter: Stay With Us

*As they came near the village to which they were going, Jesus walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?"*

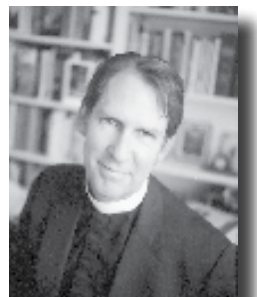
– Luke 24:28-32

The third Sunday of Easter always includes a gospel reading about Jesus returning to his disciples after his death and rising, and eating a meal with them. This year it is the familiar and much-loved story from Luke's gospel about the mysterious encounter on the road to Emmaus. Two of his disciples are leaving Jerusalem for a nearby town. They are distraught by Jesus' death, and reports that his body has disappeared from the tomb. A stranger joins them, and asks what so concerns them. When they reply, he refers to passages in the scripture which show that the Messiah must suffer before entering into glory.

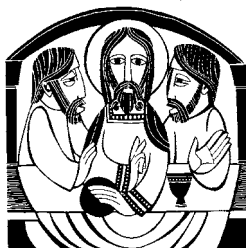
As they approach the village, the disciples invite the stranger to join them for supper. Only as he blesses the bread and shares it with them do they recognize him as Jesus, and just at that moment of recognition, he vanishes. But this encounter fills them with joy, and they run all the way back to Jerusalem to tell the story to the other disciples.

We are the fortunate heirs of their experience. Every week it is our privilege to gather with each other, to hear the word in scripture, to join Jesus at the table, and to give thanks for his constant presence among us. Every Eucharist is a celebration of Easter, of Jesus' rising, of Jesus' living with us. In this Easter season especially, we embrace every opportunity to celebrate with each other and with our savior and friend. Then we return to the world, perhaps not running, but nonetheless filled with joy. Renewed by joy, we are freshly alert for the work of compassion, of invitation, of peace-making, which Jesus has called us to undertake in his name and with his animating strength.

This comes with very best wishes to all in Eastertide, and with thanks to all of you who have made our season so joyful already.

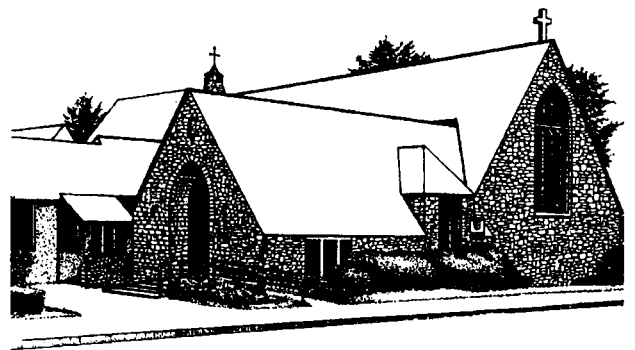
### *Edie's Continuing Education Trip*

Be it a parent, a child or a friend, eventually the demands of time and energy can become exhausting, impacting the quality of life on the caregiver as well as the person for whom the care is so necessary and important. Lay Pastoral Care is sponsoring a special workshop on Saturday, May 10th from 9.00am – 12.00 noon in the Parish Hall that is being pre-

sented by Jane Bradley. Jane, daughter of parishioner, Richard Bradley, has spent much of her career in healing trauma and crises. She has worked with high-risk adolescents, abused women and their children, developmentally disabled adults, the homeless and people with serious mental illness. As a result of over 30 years experience as a professional Caregiver, Jane has developed a unique and resilient approach to "Compassion Fatigue" With insight,

humor and first hand knowledge she reveals the process and experience of "Compassion Fatigue" and offers practical tools and strategies for recognizing and alleviating the impact of "Compassion Fatigue". ### Why We Walk

Imagine having to choose between paying your heating bill or buying groceries to feed your children. Each day, 450,000 people in the Bay State lack adequate food and for these families this is a real question every winter. **Hunger and food insecurity among MA families is actually increasing annually.** Moreover, hunger and obesity are linked, as low-income families seek to nourish themselves with food with cheaper foods, which are also higher in sugar, fats, and salt, making hunger a public health problem as well. Worst of all, the group most disproportionately affected by hunger is children, who are the most dependant on others for a stable, secure, nutritious food supply. As Christians, we believe that respecting the dignity of all people means actively working to reduce and someday end hunger in our state. This walk is one way to live out our Baptismal Promises in the world.

### Walk Day Details: Sunday morning, May 3rd

This spring, WE NEED YOU to help our congregation “walk the talk” about ending hunger. The day after Bargain Haul, Sunday, May 3rd, join thousands of other Massachusetts residents for all (or part!) of a 20 mile walk-a-thon.
