RECTOR'S LETTER: Filled With the Spirit

When the day of Pentecost had come, the apostles were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

— Acts 2:1-4



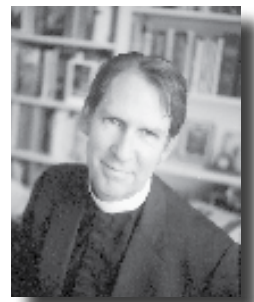
Pentecost falls on May 11th this year. It is the third great festival of the church year (after Easter and Christmas), and it commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' disciples. They were in Jerusalem at the time of the Jewish feast of Pentecost (or Feast of Weeks), which celebrated the first grain harvest fifty days after the Passover. Just as people came to Jerusalem from all over the Mediterranean world for Passover, so they did for Pentecost.

Many different local languages were represented, and though pilgrims were accustomed to speaking Greek as a common language, they were often only capable of clumsy and rudimentary exchanges with people from other places. So when the Holy Spirit

descended on Jesus' disciples and gave them power to proclaim Jesus' rising in all the different languages of the Mediterranean basin, the event not only was a wonder in itself, but more important, a sign of God's desire to include all nations and ethnicities in Jesus' saving embrace.

These many centuries later, the same desire of God is working among us. There are enormous challenges in addressing all of the world's cultures with a message of Jesus' love, and the history of Christian mission is famously fraught with well-intended disasters. But the urgency of the need to communicate in spite of barriers of language, cultural and religious sensitivities and past blunders is arguably greater now than ever before.

Especially when Christians are working with people of different faith traditions, the power of the Holy Spirit is more likely to be received if the language employed includes action, not just words. Any of us can engage in the work of God's compassion, either in active mission in unusual settings or right here. We are not required to preach or proselytize; rather, our work can be simply that of providing food, healing, education, and other basic human needs. God knows our intentions, and the Holy Spirit will give us both wisdom and stamina for this work. For the gift of the Holy Spirit, and for the companionship with each other that the Spirit provides, we give thanks.

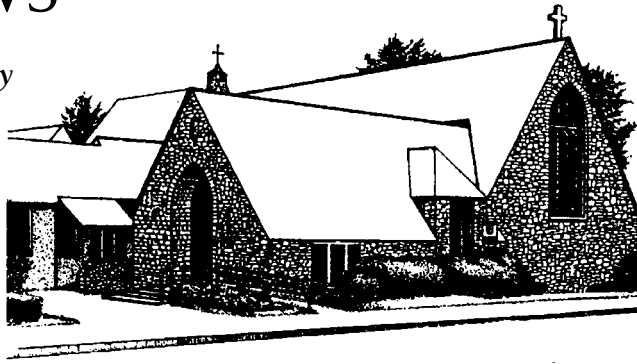
Please join us for a Property Task Force Parish Forum – June 1st

The Property Task Force has been continuing its work in evaluating the heating, cooling and energy efficiency needs of St. Andrew's. At this writing, Norian/Siani, our mechanical engineering firm is past midway through their engagement. Their mandate is to investigate the current status of the St. Andrew's heating and cooling infrastructure, the building's insulation "envelope" and to make recommendations for a more energy efficient and cost effective St. Andrew's. Members of the Property Task force will be presenting their findings at a Parish forum on Sunday, June 1st following the 10:00 a.m. service. Please join us to hear their important recommendations.

Sabbatical Plan

I will be on sabbatical (including a month of vacation) from May 4 until September 2. For those who remember the last one (2002) it may seem that six years have flown rather swiftly, as indeed they have. As previously reported, we recently engaged a mechanical engineering firm, Norian/Siani to perform a study of St. Andrew's heating and cooling infrastructure and the building's insulation "envelope." At this time, they are well on the way to completing their evaluative work. In accordance with the Long Range Plan established in 2007 this study will form the basis for improvements we will be making at St. Andrew's in the coming months and years. A Parish forum to present and discuss Norian/Siani's findings and recommendations is scheduled for June 1st after the 10:00 am service and is referenced elsewhere in this document. On a related note, work is scheduled to begin soon on our fire alarm system enhancements. We expect this work to be minimally intrusive to our worship space and to occur over the summer months.

Finally, as this is our last letter before our September communication we would like to wish you a safe, healthy and happy summer!

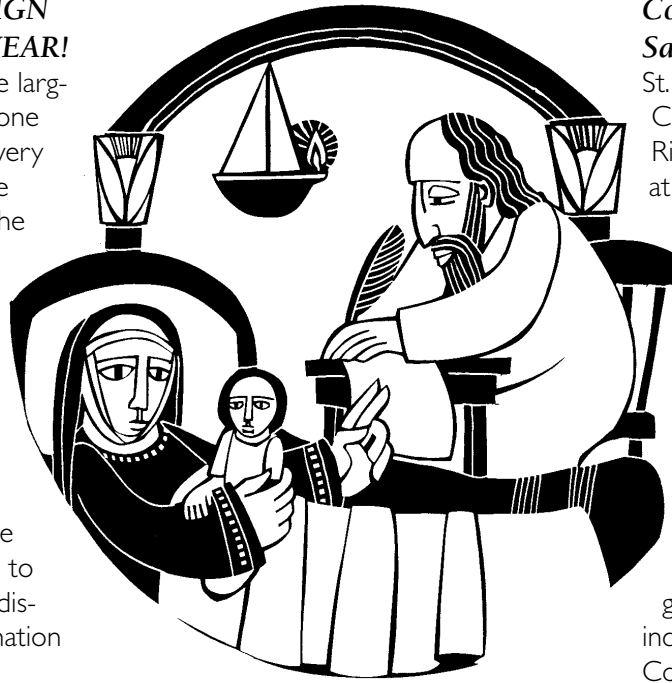

Church School TEACHER SIGN UP for NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR!

Our Church School is one of the largest ministries of our parish, and one that touches over 200 people every year! It is a ministry of the entire parish, and we invite anyone in the congregation to participate as a teacher/assistant, whether or not you have (or have had) children in the school. Teaching in the church school is a rewarding experience for the teacher, as well as for the students. It is an opportunity to reconnect with some of the Bible Stories that may have faded, and to think about your own Christian discipleship, as you help in the formation of our community's children.

As a reminder, parents with children in the church school are expected to volunteer to teach/assist at least every-other year. Unlike regular school, Church School is a co-operative, meaning that everyone shares in the work. The Church School Committee and the Clergy pledge to make the teaching experience formative for the teacher, through providing training, fellowship opportunities, mentoring, good curriculum resources, and classroom management support. We ask you to pledge your time and effort. Each grade level needs a teaching cohort of five teachers to trade off lead teaching and assisting responsibilities. You do NOT have to teach your child's grade level, if you would prefer to teach a different level (though, of course, you are welcome to teach your child's class). Teaching our children about God's love for them as the unique and wonderful people they are is probably the most important gift we can give our children! Please consider becoming part of this ministry offering this special gift next year.

As we move into the last of the pre-summer weeks at St. Andrew's, we celebrate our Outreach Ministries in many ways. We had a focus in April on Hunger Advocacy, and will move into May highlighting *Women In Need* issues. The schedule is brimming with activities that focus our attention on the needs of others and how we can help them, particularly before we shift into the more self-indulgent days of summer. There are opportunities for education, awareness, and most importantly participation. Please mark your calendars now for these important dates and find ways to help others who are in need.

By the time this issue of the CALL reaches you, we will have already wrapped up *Bargain Haul* and its Raffle for Bay St. Louis. I would like to bring to your attention three important goals of these activities, and remind you that it is not too late to support any or all of them. The *Bargain Haul* this year highlighted the opportunity to contribute items for *Cradle to Crayons*. This charity focuses on providing children in need with new or slightly used items. Donated items (toys, games, etc.), clothing, and school supplies (which have to be new) were all collected for the parish night sale, and then purchased for donation to *Cradle to Crayons*. In addition to *Bargain Haul's* support of *Cradle to Crayons* and fundraising for Outreach, the Raffle for Bay St. Louis was an important activity to support our sister parish in Mississippi. As our youth group makes the final preparations for their trip there this summer and the imminent reconstruction by Christ Church on their land, we are gathering funds to make a donation of

significance to their efforts. It seems so long ago that Katrina hit that it has subsided in our everyday consciousness, but the difficulties remain for our sister parish. We should be proud of our progress on gathering support for them, and look forward to giving our capital contribution to them in the near future.

This article will also come on the heels of our St. Andrew's Team's participation in the annual *Walk for Hunger*. We should easily break our \$3,000 goal. If you missed the opportunity to pledge support, checks can be sent to the parish office with *Walk for Hunger* in the memo section. There will also be the annual postal food drive – *Stamp Out Hunger* – on May 10. Simply put canned or non-perishable goods out for your letter carrier and they will deliver them to a local collection station. For parts of Wellesley, this intake is done at St. Andrew's, where we sort the food and send it along to the Wellesley Food Pantry. And of course, any day of the week we accept food items – particularly "meals in a can" – in the bins in the Narthex, which are also taken to the WFP.

If donating food is only partially fulfilling for you and you would like to serve hungry people directly, then you can sign up for one of our Salvation Army dinner nights in Framingham. The commitment lasts from about 4:45 – 7:15 in the evening, and is appropriate for families with children 8+ years old. We have two dates on the calendar already – May 14 and July 8 – with more to be scheduled soon. Please contact Tim Phillips for more information.

To tie in with the *Women In Need* theme of May, on Sunday May 18 after the 10:00 service we will be having a forum for *El Hogar* and *Our Little Roses*, the two orphanages in Honduras that we have supported for years through mission trips and contributions. We will be visited by former St. Andrew's parishioner Melissa von Stade Colina who will speak of her transformative

And of course there is always our partner church's summer camp program that needs the help of many volunteers to run effectively. We are signed up for duty during the week of July 14 – 18 for St. Stephen's. If you can't make the trip into Boston, not to worry! We need helping hands here in the suburbs as well, shopping for food, packing snacks, and making lunches (both hot and cold). Of course for the more adventurous we invite you to join us for the annual camp outing on Friday July 18. Please see Catherine Drum for details and the join in the effort.
