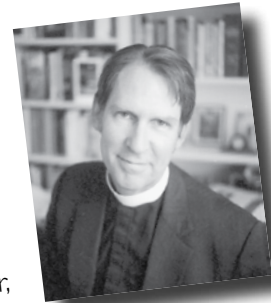


Holy Week and Easter

RECTOR'S LETTER: Cry Of the Rooster

And Jesus said to the disciples, "You will all become deserters; for it is written, 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered.' But after I am raised up, I will go before you to Galilee." Peter said to him, "Even though all become deserters, I will not." Jesus said to him, "Truly I tell you, this day, this very night, before the cock crows twice, you will deny me three times." But he said vehemently, "Even though I must die with you, I will not deny you." —Mark 14:27-31

A member of St. Andrew's reported to me his recent visit to Jerusalem. He made particular mention of his visit to the Church of St. Peter Gallicantu (St. Peter of the Cockcrow), and I remembered a sensation that has thrilled me repeatedly when I've stayed in the Holy City. Like many populous cities of the Middle East, Jerusalem is one in which a visiting sleeper is awakened both by the Muslim call to prayer and the dawn cry of roosters. When I hear the roosters cry in the early Jerusalem hours, I often think of the story of Peter and Jesus, of which we will be reminded again during the coming Holy Week.



Peter famously protested that he would be loyal to Jesus whatever happened, and just as famously he retreated in fear when, only a few hours later, he had the chance to support Jesus publicly. For Peter the crowing of the rooster triggered his shocked awareness that, despite his firm intention, he had abandoned Jesus in the time of crisis.

Like roosters on New England church weathervanes, which remind us of Peter's experience, the Church of St. Peter Gallicantu reminds Christians that loyalty to Jesus is impossible to sustain. It is even more important for us to remember what happened after the cockcrow: that Jesus, though saddened by Peter's weakness, forgave him completely, and entrusted to him a major leadership responsibility.

One of our most liberating experiences of Holy Week and Easter is to remember the maddening persistence of our sinfulness, and the even more powerful persistence of God's forgiveness. In the same week in which the depth and consequences of human sin are underscored most vividly, we celebrate our greatest freedom from sin. God raises Jesus from death, cancels the guilt of our betrayals, and enables us to begin again with a clean slate.

When I hear the rooster cry in Jerusalem, I am reminded not only of the daily evidence of our betrayal of God, but also of the daily renewal, sometimes the hourly renewal, of Jesus' forgiveness. As Jesus rose from death, so we rise from sin, thanks to God's strong and compassionate love for us. We rise, as at the beginning of each new day, to continue our part in the saving and healing work of God. That is our Easter joy and privilege, for which we offer our lives in thanksgiving.

FOCUS: Holy Week and Easter

New Holy Week Services

This year, in addition to our regular schedule of Holy Week services, we are adding three services: on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings at 7:30 p.m.

On Monday and Wednesday we will offer a simple celebration of the Holy Eucharist in the Children's Chapel with ample periods of silence for meditation and reflection.

On Tuesday evening we will offer a service of Stations of the Cross, an ancient devotional practice of reenacting Jesus' journey from the place of his trial to site of his execution. The service will begin in the Transept Chapel and all are welcome to attend. Please speak to Edie, Addison or Chris to find out more about this service, which is a powerful way to enrich the Holy Week experience.

We will also be adding a "Children's Service" as part of the Noon Good Friday liturgy. Children will leave the church shortly after the service begins and go into the Children's Chapel for a special program exploring the meaning of Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

Highlights from the Musical Selections for Holy Week and Easter

Holy Week Services start with the Maundy Thursday liturgy when we will be singing Durufle's *Ubi caritas* and chanting the Pange lingua as we process with candles with the Blessed Sacrament to the side chapel.

On Good Friday we welcome Boston based cellist, Reinmar Seidler, who will play the Fifth movement of an eight movement piece of Olivier Messiaen's called *Quartet for the End of Time* scored for piano and cello. Messiaen wrote this quartet during his time as a POW during the Second World War. It was performed by inmates of the Stalag VIII - A in Gorlitz, Germany (currently Zgovelac, Poland) on January 15, 1941 in front of 400 prisoners and prison guards. It is called *Louange a l'Eternite de Jesus (Praise to the eternity of Jesus)* The tempo marking is "infinitely slowly."

For the Easter Vigil at 7:30 the choir will sing Stanford's beautiful quartet "When Mary through the garden went." Easter Sunday at 9:00 and 11:00 a.m., we are fortunate to feature, once again, the Beacon Brass Quintet and percussion. They will accompany us on all the familiar Easter hymns as well as a double choir piece during the Offertory for brass and choir by Victoria. The Junior Choir will join us at the 9:00 a.m. service.



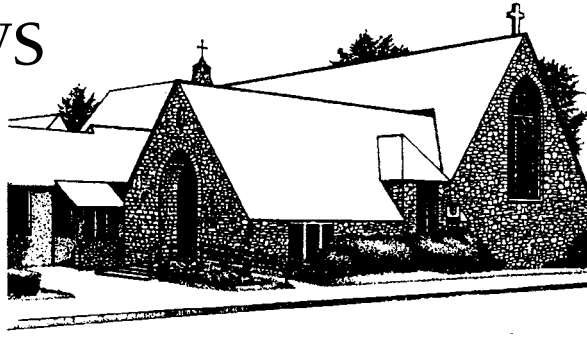
PARISH NEWS

O Ye Fire and Heat, Bless Ye the Lord!

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

As we await the warming days of spring and the end of the winter heating season we are pleased to update you on the ongoing efforts of the St. Andrew's Property Task Force. In particular we are now focused on the replacement of our antiquated and leaking heating system. With annual plumbing and maintenance costs exceeding \$20,000 we are anxious to make an investment in our future through replacement of our old system with a cost effective new one. To be successful in this next and important phase of our deferred maintenance challenge we will need to call on the financial assistance of all who worship and participate in the ministries of St. Andrew's. We are looking forward to engaging in a dialogue with each of you about our challenges and how you can help.

Since we last discussed property matters in this space we are pleased to report that much groundwork has been accomplished yet there remains much still to be done. We have completed the planning and engineering work to make our building safer, more attractive, and more efficient. In 2008 we installed a new fire alarm system which is now in compliance with cur-



rent building code. Last summer we installed improved building insulation and double-pane energy-efficient windows in the office wing. These efforts evidence our intention to keep our headquarters in good shape, so that the many ministries of this vital community can continue to grow and thrive.

The Property Task Force has completed a comprehensive list of deferred maintenance projects which has been prioritized according to urgency and economic impact with badly needed heating system renovations atop the list. We hope to begin the work on this system as soon as the winter heating season concludes. To determine the availability of funds we are beginning discussions with parishioners about this effort and plan to engage with everyone soon. In the meantime we invite your thoughts and comments and ask for your faithful consideration of financial participation in investing in the future of St. Andrew's.

Village Cooperative Playgroup has openings for 2009/2010 school year

The Village Cooperative Playgroup, a nonprofit parent-run cooperative for children ages 2-3, is now registering families for September 2009. Designed as a bridge between home and preschool, your child will spend two mornings a week with other 2 and 3 year olds. As part of this non-profit, parent-run organization, you will participate on a rotating basis with 3 parents, supervising groups of up to 10

children in a variety of activities including free play, crafts, and music. Babysitting for younger siblings is available.

The Village Cooperative Playgroup has been in existence since 1970 with classroom space at the St. Andrews Church in Wellesley. All children should be 2 to 3.3 by September 1st to join.

Playgroup meets 2 hours, twice weekly on Mon/Wed or Tues/Thurs. Each parent provides supervision

approximately 40% of the time. Class runs September through May. Tuition for the entire year is only \$400.00.

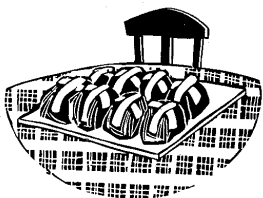
Christian Learning in Holy Week for all ages!

Church School Hosts the Family "Passover Seder Meal"

The Seder is from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall and concludes in time for the evening service – all are welcome! The program is followed by a potluck supper; please bring your choice of entrée or salad. Drinks and lamb cakes (for dessert!) will be provided by the Church School Committee.

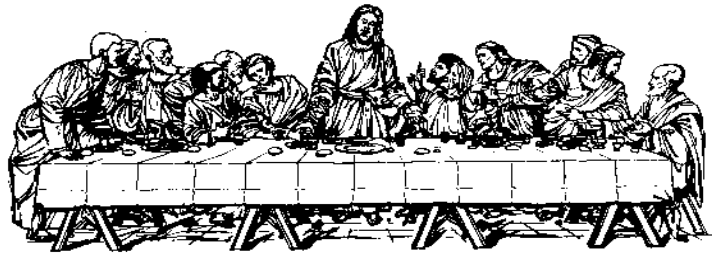
Maundy Thursday All-Parish Overnight Prayer Vigil

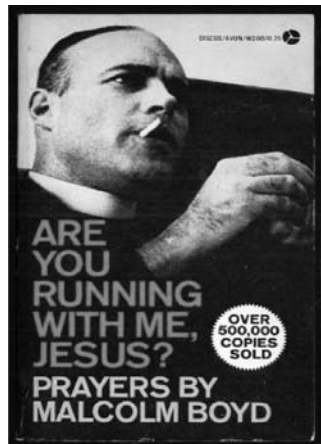

Whispers from the Parish Library...

For this month's **CALL**, Carol has invited me to share my thoughts about a book that has profoundly shaped how I see the world. The one that immediately jumped to mind is, surprisingly, not a recent book, but just celebrated its 40th anniversary in 2005. It is a collection of about a hundred poems written by Episcopal Priest, Malcolm Boyd (a fellow West Coaster). Each of the short, crisp, beat-poems in **"Are you Running with Me, Jesus?"** is a fast-paced, no-holds barred, straight-talking prayer. And the



reason this book had such a profound impact on my prayer life, is that each of the prayers are addressed directly to Jesus. Before reading this book, it had never occurred to me to pray to Jesus. I just prayed to God, usually on my knees in church. But some of Boyd's prayers hardly seem, as I tell the Rite-13 kids, "church appropriate". Boyd's prayers speak to Jesus about the full of the highs and lows of humanity – celebrations, elations, risks, failures, depressions, confusions, Boyd talks to Jesus about it all. There

is a freeing quality to their emotional honesty with Jesus that makes these prayers so meaningful, even if their poetic style is very rooted in a 1960's beat-era cadence. Boyd knows Jesus to be not just a Lord, but also a brother, a friend, and most of all, a companion in the challenges and joys of being human. And that's something I think we all need, someone, as we pray each Sunday, "to whom all hearts are open, are desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid." Boyd's prayers helped me pray more with an open heart, help me hold less back from God, and helped me begin to form a more complex and meaningful relationship with Jesus, my Lord and Savior and brother and mentor and friend. OUTREACH

The Mission of the Month for April is of course "Bargain Haul"

St Andrew's Outreach ministries are a major recipient of the dollars raised by Bargain Haul each year and we would not be able to meet those commitments without the extraordinary work of the whole St Andrew's community as we come together each year to make Bargain Haul a success. More about Bargain Haul elsewhere in this edition of *The CALL*.

B-SAFE 2009

This year we are dedicating the proceeds of the **Bargain Haul Parish Night Raffle** towards our substantial financial commitment to St Stephen's Church in the South End, and specifically their summer camp program **B-SAFE 2009**, as part of the May Mission of the Month - "Boston Youth Initiatives". By the time you read the May edition of the **CALL** the Raffle will be over so let me preview this here and tell you more about **B-SAFE 2009**

(the **B**ishop's **S**ummer **A**cademic and **F**un **E**nrichment program).

For most children in communities such as St Andrew's a vacation and/or summer camp experience is just another part of summer. Until B-SAFE came into being this was not the case for the more than 500 children - ranging from kindergartners to high schoolers working as CIT's - who will spend their weekdays from late June to mid August in this extraordinary program run from 6 citywide sites - in the South End, Dorchester, Roxbury, Mattapan and Chelsea. The program gives these kids a safe, fun place to spend their summer as well as academic enrichment and leadership opportunities. There are 3 age appropriate programs.



B-SAFE's Elementary School LEARN Program

LEARN stands for Leadership, Enrichment, Academics, Recreation and Nurture. As part of the B-SAFE's LEARN program, children rotate through academic and enrichment activities on Monday through Thursday mornings. The two academic programs that are offered include Word (reading and writing) and the Numbers Club (math.) Enrichment classes include art, computer training, music, and dance. In addition, children also have 30 minutes of "Drop Everything and Read!" (DEAR) time each day.

The B-SAFE LEARN program also features a variety of sports and games under the direction of a site Athletic Director, often at a nearby public or school gym or outdoor space; children also swim twice per week at a nearby

swimming facility. Two afternoons a week, children from each site go on a local Boston-based field trip. Each Friday, children go on a full-day field trip outside of the city, visiting parks, beaches, and farms.

A healthy lunch and snack are served each day. These are prepared and delivered by supporting partner churches such as St Andrew's, which also arrange and host the weekly Friday outings. As usual we will be doing this again this summer – our designated week had not been confirmed as this edition of *The CALL* went to press but look out for announcements on this later this spring – we will be looking for volunteers to support our week.

B-SAFE's Middle School YLC Program

YLC stands for Youth Leadership Corps. As part of B-SAFE's YLC program, youth spend their time similarly to the elementary school children, but with content and schedule geared toward their age group. In addition, the YLC offers special training, workshops, projects, and discussion groups around civic leadership and environmental protection.

B-SAFE's Teen CIT Program

The B-SAFE program also employs and supports 90 teens Counselors-In-Training (CITs)
