RECTOR'S LETTER: Raised On the Third Day

***F**or I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve.*

—St. Paul to the Corinthians (1 Cor. 15:1ff.)

Thanks to St. Paul, writing to the church in Corinth about twenty years after Jesus' death and rising, we have a clear sense of the earliest form of the Easter message: Jesus died, was buried, was raised from death by God, and appeared to his disciples. That core proclamation, from shortly after the first Easter, came to be elaborated in the stories of the empty tomb, and of Jesus' appearances to his disciples. By the time the gospels were written down, those stories long since had been memorized and circulated widely. The four accounts of Jesus' rising and appearances that we find in the Gospels show the many variations of the story that developed within a few generations of the first Easter Day.



I commend the whole fifteenth chapter of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians for our meditation during the Easter season, because it is one of the first sustained reflections on Jesus' rising and its meaning for his followers. Essentially, Paul proclaims Jesus' rising as the event that liberates believers from the fear of death, from the power of death itself, and from sinfulness that arises from the fear of death. The Easter season is a sustained time of praise and thanksgiving to God, who has set us free from the worst that can happen to us. The power of Jesus' rising frees us to re-dedicate ourselves to serve others lovingly, even sacrificially, as Jesus did.

"Listen," Paul says: "I will tell you a mystery! We will not all die, but we will be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed."

The change happens not just at the end of our lives. It can happen now, in this present time, in each successive encounter and episode of our lives. As the community called to proclaim Jesus' rising in this place, we encourage each other to serve with boldness, generosity and love. What we most yearn for we have received already: the promise of God's presence and support in all circumstances, challenging or joyful.

I'll conclude with lines from Christopher Wordsworth's great Easter hymn: "Christ is risen, we are risen! Shed upon us heavenly grace,/ rain and dew and beams of glory from the brightness of thy face;/ that, with hearts in heaven dwelling, we on earth may fruitful be." (Hymnal, # 191)

May your Easter Day and season be filled with joy!

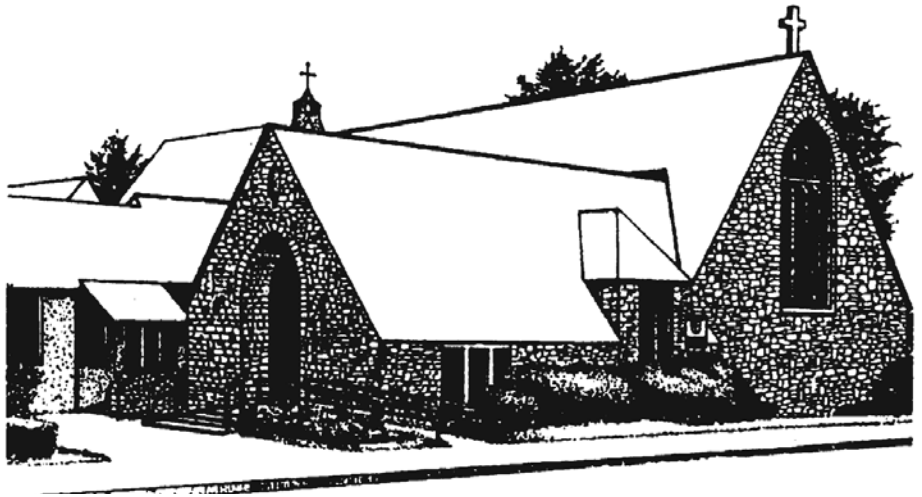
Resurrection and Salvation Recognition and Sustainability Repairing and Supporting

What can words beginning with R and S signify?

Christian faith is anchored in the belief that Christ died and rose again and was seen among his followers. He overcame death and promised that we too can overcome death – not in this life – but in eternal life. This promise of salvation is given to us not because we are perfect human beings but because we are sinners whose faith in God will save us.

Christ's resurrection and promise of our salvation is the celebration we have just shared in the Easter story. At St. Andrew's, Holy Week was observed with quiet and thoughtful worship services. Beginning with the Easter Vigil on Saturday night, our services became a glorious fusion of joyful music, beautiful flowers and uplifting liturgies.

During the month of March, our Lenten Wednesday evening programs are centered on the spirituality of food. Now the words "recognition" and "sustainability" become part of our earthly conversations. As the world population grows larger and as we strive to make food both affordable and nutritious, we are recognizing the potentially irreversible cost of these goals. If we fail to plan for a sustainable and abundant future



we will burden our children with the consequences of our selfish ethical, economic and political choices.

The shared experience both of worship and of learning through the Lenten programs was offered within the walls of our church building. It is a most earthly structure whose increasing age requires repairing and, hence, a need to ask you for financial support. With sustainability in mind, the Vestry has chosen the most energy efficient repairs for the building. Over time, these choices reduce our energy and maintenance expenses. We are asking all parish members to help with bearing the costs of this work as they are able. By installing new windows in the Montessori wing we will save in fuel costs almost immediately. We will also keep our building in good repair by attending to roof, wall, electrical and other safety needs.

Thank you for supporting these efforts to make St. Andrew's a sustainable and visible community of service in this generation and for many generations to come.

Church School Hosts the Family "Passover Seder" Potluck

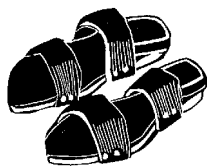

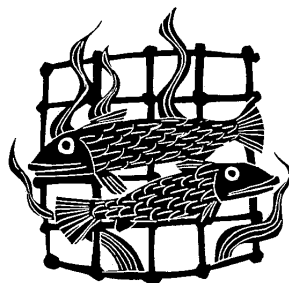

May 1st SAPAS Concert:

Boston City Singers and Saengerfest Mens' Chorus

There has been a change in the last program of the season to be presented by the St Andrew's Performing Arts Series. The concert originally planned for May 7th has been cancelled, and will be replaced by a new concert on Saturday, May 1st, at 7:30 pm.

The concert will comprise performances by both the Boston City Singers and Saengerfest Mens' Chorus. Boston City Singers is an extensive program that provides in-depth music education and performances, both choral and instrumental, among children and young people in Dorchester and Jamaica Plain. Over 80% of the membership lives in the City of Boston. BCS includes beginning classes starting at age 4, and multiple training choruses for children ages 7 through 12, including instruction in Haitian Creole.

The BCS Concert Chorus performing at the SAPAS concert comprises 60 girls and boys (ages 12-20, with changed and unchanged voices) who receive expert vocal coaching in small ensembles, and enjoy a challenging repertoire ranging from medieval to contemporary, jazz to Broadway, and international folk music, especially from Australasia and Africa. Their recent performances include full concerts, collaborations with a wide variety of ensembles, and opera and Broadway appearances. The group tours regularly, and has performed in recent years Newfoundland, Australia, and New Zealand; a South Africa tour is being planned for summer 2011.

Boston Saengerfest Men's Chorus is comprised about 70 male choristers who enjoy the camaraderie of singing at weekly rehearsals and performing in four or five concerts each year. Their traditional but wide-ranging repertoire includes folk songs, love songs, spirituals and sacred music, classical excerpts, traditional English and Welsh songs and anthems, and an occasional show tune. The Chorus was officially formed in 1991 after some 45 members of Saengerfest were invited to participate in the Festival of Welsh Male Chorus in London's Royal Albert Hall in 1992.

The Chorus still sings regularly in the biennial London Welsh male chorus festivals, and they have also performed in Carnegie Hall, Salisbury and Winchester Cathedrals, Boston's Museum of Fine Arts, Lisbon, Toronto, Vancouver, and on WGBH.

The concert's visual artist will be Evelyn Bernal, who will be displaying a selection of her watercolor paintings.

The concert starts at 7:30 pm. Tickets will be \$20 for adults, \$10 for seniors, and \$5 for students

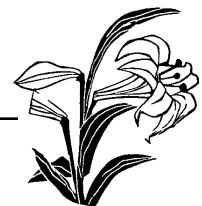
