St. Andrew's Green Team—Steward's for God's planet

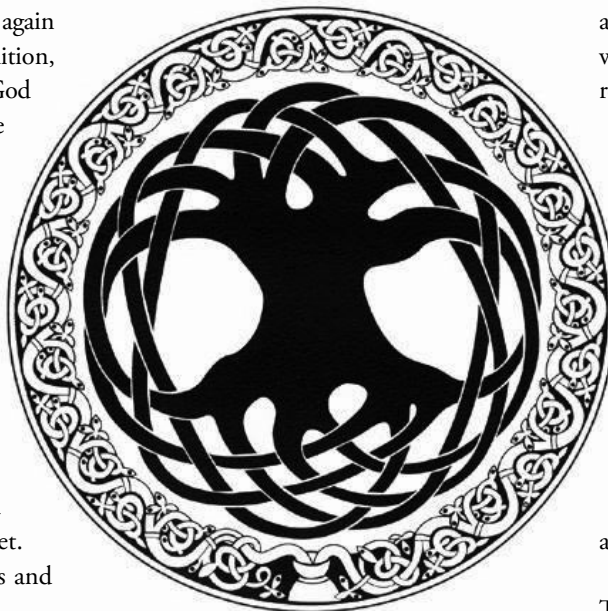

"The Eternal placed the Human Being in the Garden of Eden to till it and to tend it." Genesis 2:15
"Greater indeed than the creation of humankind is the creation of the heavens and the earth.
Yet, most of humanity does not understand." Qur'an 40:57

In the October CALL, we were once again reminded that in the Christian tradition, we are all stewards of the gifts that God has given us and that our call is to take care of these gifts to accomplish God's purposes. What is God's greatest gift? Some say it is the world that we live in.

Have we been good stewards of God's garden? More and more of us are aware that we have not. We are tilling, but not sustaining God's Creation. Fossil fuel consumption is putting more greenhouse gases in the air than the earth can absorb. Global warming is creating havoc on the planet. Pollution is choking our land, streams and oceans.

We see and read about its effects and our role in it every day. This constant barrage of evidence of our complicity is mind-boggling



ask why we undertook these projects. There was no epiphany to start doing our part in responding to global warming. The impetus was that old steam lines were failing and had cost the church over \$60,000 in repairs over a two-year period. We were leaking treasure and had to stop it. Fortunately through the generosity of the parish, the resources were available to carry out this effort.

We also learned a very important lesson. There is something we can do that will help to reduce global warming right here in our own community, and at the same time will save us money. We can all be better stewards of God's greatest gift.

This fall, we will be forming a "Green Team" to encourage more energy reduction at the church and throughout the parish community. As you expect, our wardens, vestry and clergy are fully behind this effort. We're currently seeking volunteers to make this a success. You don't need to be anything more than someone interested in being a **good steward of God's garden.**

Our agenda will depend on who joins and ideas that we all contribute. At church, there is more to do. We hope to install thermo-pane windows in the school wing next summer. We need more energy saving lighting. Simple things like adding low flow faucet aerators and keep up our recycling efforts and use

and often too much for us to process. We feel guilty, helpless, and don't know what to do. Sending another check for flood relief doesn't seem to address the problem. Global warming is a justice issue. Our role in it creates a clear moral obligation to help solve it. What do we do?

There is good news. Witness what we did here at church. St. Andrew's should be very proud of our heating plant and window projects that have lowered heating costs by over \$22,000 a year and reduced annual carbon emissions by 174,000 lbs. of CO2. However, let us not be too sanctimonious and instead

more recycled products. We can do similar things in our homes if we are willing to make changes in the way we live. Think about your own lighting and water usage, take shorter showers, do more with recycling, upgrade heating and cooling systems, add insulation.

Jim Blackwell has agreed to help form the Green Team. Jim is now working with Massachusetts Inter-faith Power and Light <http://www.mipandl.org/>, a non-profit whose mission is to provide a faith based response to climate change. MIP&L guided St. Andrew's in developing the plans for our energy upgrades. MIP&L has great resources to help us in this stewardship including information about energy audits, rebate programs and strategies to promote environmental stewardship. Rector's Letter

I Am the Bread of Life The Reverend Addison C. Hall

So they said to Jesus, "What sign are you going to give us, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing? Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'" Then Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." They said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

—John 6: 30–35

This will be the gospel reading when we gather to worship on Thanksgiving Day. Food will be on our minds, and the aromas of food well may be on our fingers and in our nostrils, as many of us will have come to church straight from the kitchen.

Not entirely by coincidence, November is a month in which we focus our Outreach energies on providing food. We take up a collection through the month to equip St. Stephen's, our sister parish in the South End of Boston, to make food distributions to people in need at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. That collection also supports the burgeoning B-Safe summer enrichment programs, for children at risk in the Roxbury

and Dorchester neighborhoods.

We also remember and contribute to the Wellesley Food Pantry's ministry, and continue our monthly rotation of providing an evening meal at the Salvation Army headquarters in Framingham. Many of our parishioners are active in other ministries that provide vital subsistence to our sisters and brothers for whom abundant food is not a given. We give thanks for faithful members of our community, for example, who help to provide food and shelter for homeless families through the Metrowest Interfaith Hospitality Network.

As we gather throughout the month at eucharist, to celebrate our community life at the auction and on St. Andrew's Day, and on Thanksgiving, we will remember and give thanks for Jesus' presence among us as the bread of life. Jesus is among us not just to share our table fellowship, and rejoice with us in the abundance of good things God has provided, but also to encourage us in our ministries of sharing abundance. Jesus reminds us that there is more to nourishment



than food, important as food is. There is the teaching, the way of life, that God gives us. It is a way of life that is open to everyone, and especially to people in need. We give thanks for this bread, both figurative and literal, that God gives us so generously, and for God's enlisting us in service of others.

Especially, we give thanks to Jesus, who relieves us of our hunger and thirst by leading us in ministries of sharing, and who feeds both our bodies and our spirits.

This month is also the time of the Diocesan Convention, which brings us together with all other Episcopal churches in the eastern Massachusetts area.

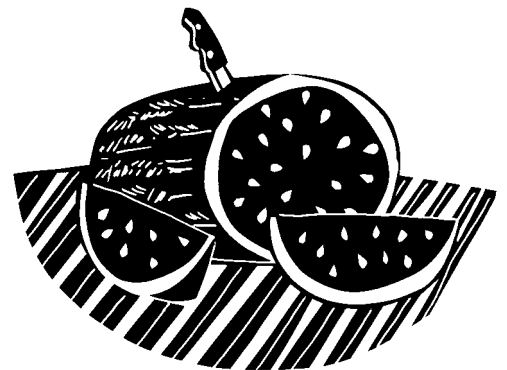

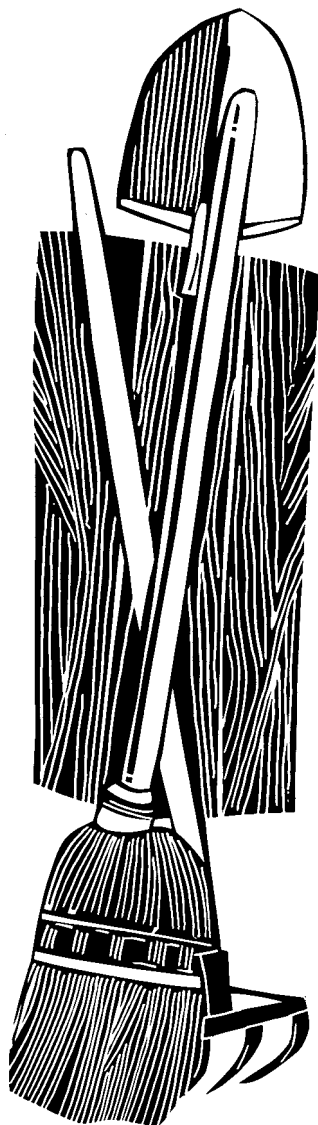

Building Moral Courage — November Christian Learning Series

How do we respond when we hear an offensive remark in a meeting? Or when we begin to wonder about the ethics of an assignment or a project at work? Or when we feel deeply concerned about an unjust situation in the world, but too small to make a difference? As Christians, we are heirs to a rich and diverse legacy of moral theology and ethical tradition—and yet often it seems difficult to draw upon these spiritual resources in taking

concrete action when we face moral dilemmas in our lives. This six-week Christian Learning Series will explore the relationship between various strands in the web of Christian ethical thought and how we approach our own moral decision making as go through our lives. In each session we will spend some time learning about a particular approach to Christian ethics, and then using that as a springboard into conversation about a contemporary moral issue and how we can find greater courage to respond to it in our own lives. The purpose of this series is not to arrive at ethical consensus, but rather to cultivate our moral instincts and our capacities to reflect, refine, and act upon them faithfully. Please join us!

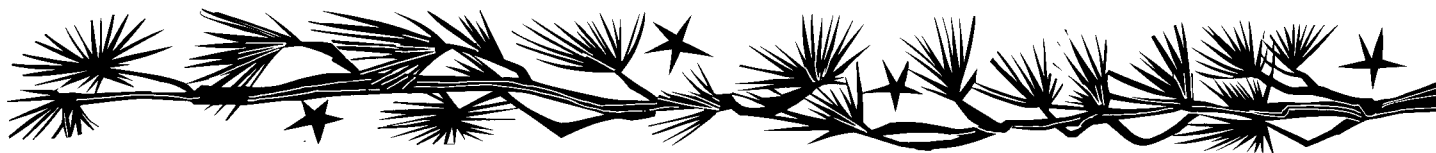
